Non-Catholic Columnist Lays Jesuit

CHICAGO—Paul T. Quinn, non-Catholic Chicago columnist, is following the celebration of the eighty-fifth anniversary of the founding of Holy Family Church by Father Arnold Damsch, Jesuit missionary, priest, Father Damsch, as "one of a long line of Jesuits serving in Chicago from 1871 when Father Marquette established an Italian mission here."

In Holy Family church, which is marking a series of events in celebration of its jubilee, stands a constellation of seven lighted lamps burning constantly before a statue of the Blessed Virgin and which commemorate the names of the

church from its foundation in 1871. The story is told that when the five lamps and Father Damsch were conducting a mission in Kentucky, informed of the attack upon threatened St. Patrick, he moved throughout the night in the Kentucky church, where he was giving the mission and promised that if his church would be opened he would have seven lighted lamps. His vow was kept and the Jesuit Fathers kept the promise.
