

Margaret Anglin Slated In First Joint Lecture

Member of an old Canadian family prominent in the public and Catholic life of Canada for several generations, Margaret Anglin, actress and producer, appears here Sunday evening

next, Nov. 13, at 8:30 P. M. in the third event of the Christian Culture Lecture Series at Aquinas Auditorium.

Miss Anglin's brother, the Rt. Honorable Francis Anglin who died a few years ago was the Chief Justice of Canada for many years. This position corresponds to that of Chief Justice Hughes in the United States. Educated at Montreal and various schools in France, Margaret Anglin has for many years been a symbol of the pure drama in American theatrical life.

She appears here in a joint lecture with Louis K. Anspacher, dramatic critic and lecturer in an event unique in the cultural life of Rochester. "The Social Power of the Drama." All seats are reserved for this event.

At the time of Miss Anglin's birth her father was the Speaker of the House of Commons. Her life since has been a long history

of attempts to preserve the idealism of the stage. Perhaps no better appreciation of her work could be given than that by Dr. Richard Burton, noted critic of the drama.

Doctor Burton writes: "Margaret Anglin has the technique of her craft at her finger ends. Each her training and her gift give her the power adequately to show the world all possible forms and phases of that mighty thing—the theatre, in its best estate. But she has something more. She is a woman who has dedicated her remarkable powers and personality to the highest interests of her profession. She has remained an idealist in a day when anyone so doing runs the risk of being labeled herself, and her material interests to the art she follows and illuminates."


