400 Troops Hear Director of NCCS

SPARTANBURG, S. C. — Dr. Franklin Dunham, Executive Director of the National Catholic Community Service, was the principal speaker at the Communion Breakfast sponsored by Camp Croft Holy Name Society in honor of the Feast of Christ the King.

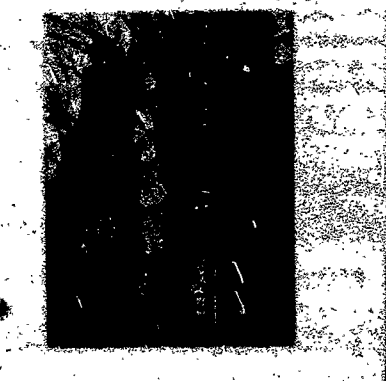
