ARMY NURSE ARRIVES AT NEW GUINEA POST

HORNELL.—Lieut. Mary Jacobs, a nurse in the United States Army, has arrived in New Guinea, according to a dispatch received in Hornell on Monday. Lieut. Jacobs is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Jacobs of Hornell.

The contingent of nurses, of which she is a member, arrived in New Guinea on Oct. 26, fully equipped for field duty. Lieut. Jacobs, prior to her new assignment, has been stationed in Australia since last May.

Miss Jacobs was graduated from St. Ann's School in 1928. Upon her graduation from Hornell in 1931, she entered Our Lady of Victory Hospital in Lackawanna. She was graduated in 1934, a member of the last class to have diplomas signed by the late Father Baker.

Before her enlistment in the Army, Miss Jacobs spent three years at Murray Hill and Mount Morris Hospitals. For two years she was affiliated with the Orthopedic Hospital in New York.

Holy Name Campaign

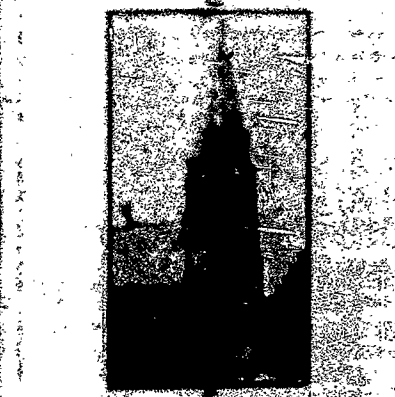
