His Excellency the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, celebrated the Jubilee Mass and paid glowing tribute to the three pastors who looked after the flock of Holy Redeemer parish from its inception. Particularly cited was the Rev. William F. Stauder, the present pastor, whose apostolic zeal and careful management has brought the parish along to its present status, free of debt, with a church beautifully decorated and complete parish plant of school, rectory and hall.

The School Sisters of Notre Dame who have also labored at Holy Redeemer's for seventy-five years were praised by His Excellency.

"The Way, the Truth and the Light" was the theme of the Bishop's sermon and he praised the people of Holy Redeemer Parish for having followed the paths thus pointed out.

Achievements of Holy Redeemer parish through the years were commended and the work done in recent years, the improvements brought about, were acclaimed in view of the problems presented by many new parishes being established in the neighborhood.

Assisting His Excellency in the Mass were: Assistant Priest, the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, V.G. Deacons of Honor, the Rt. Rev. Magr. William F. Bergan, Chancellor of the Diocese, and the Rt. Both Father Geiger and Father Schneider are former assistant pastors, and traveled long distances from their parishes in King Ferry and Wayland to be present.

The pastor paid special tribute to Father Geiger's work among the youth in Holy Redeemer parish, stating that many young men of the neighborhood were practicing their Faith because of contact with Father Geiger in the Aigo Club.

**Safe and Well, Word
Received By Kin Of
Priest In Japan**

AUBURN. The Rev. P. J. Byrne S.M., cousin of Election Commissioner J. Joseph Byrne, is in good health and in good quarters for the duration of the War according to a letter received from Rev. W. F. Murphy who recently returned from Japan.

Father Byrne is an Auburnian, a graduate of Holy Family Parochial School and a former student of the Auburn High School. His family now resides in Washington. Before leaving for Japan seven years ago he spent some time visiting relatives and friends in Auburn.

Father Murphy in his letter said "The Gripsholm recently brought me home from my mission in Japan. Before leaving I was able to visit with Father Byrne and he asked me to drop you a line extending his personal regards. Father Byrne is the only American priest who was permitted by the Japanese government to remain in that country. It is possible he was granted that privilege because of his age. You will be happy to know that his health is good and that he is interned in my former rectory, which is a very comfortable home."

"Since the rest of us Maryknoll priests were sent home against our will Father Byrne has the added burden of ministering to the spiritual needs of a large number of Japanese Catholics, assisted only by a few devoted native priests. For the duration of the war Father Byrne will be unable to write to you or you to him. The Field Star (the Maryknoll Magazine) for October and November will give you a good picture of present conditions of Americans in Japanese occupied territory. If, however, you wish to learn more about Father Byrne and his work, I shall be happy to supply you with whatever information I can."
