many articles to the then current ecclesiastical and secular reviews in the defense of the faith in condemnation of atheism and on the subject of evolution. He was also the author of what we would call today a propaganda novel. He was a musician of accomplished ability and did much by this means to beautify divine services. He was a firm devotee of amateur theatricals and held that they were an effective means of advancing education and culture in the parish. These productions, he personally directed.

In a material way Father FitzSimons accomplished much. In he built the present school building and Brendan Hall at the cost of about \$25,000.00. In 1898 he beautified the church interior. His keen artistic appreciation enabled him to provide unusual impressive statuary together with very effective pictorial decorations.

He unintentionally described his own work and those of his predecessors when he wrote in 1894: "All the appointments of the parish are superior in every respect. Indeed there are few parishes in Western New York that can boast of such complete equipment for parish work. . . . And there are few as intelligent and law abiding communities as ours."

TRIBUTE TO PASTOR

During Father FitzSimons' pastorate, Bishop McQuaid paid a well deserved tribute both to pastor and people by making Father FitzSimons an M. R. (Missionary Recreant). St. Rose was the only country parish so signally honored. Father FitzSimons was appointed pastor of St. Mary's Church in Rochester in September, 1912.

Father John F. Farrell became pastor in December, 1912. His pastorate extended to May, 1930. During his nineteen years as pastor, by very capable management and rare financial ability he was able to liquidate entirely all church indebtedness. By his zealous and close attention to every detail of pastoral duty he endeared himself to the members of St. Rose's parish. He left in 1930 to take charge of St. Ann's Church in Hornell.

Father Neville succeeded Father Farrell in 1930 and remained till 1934. At the time of his appointment he was in his declining years and in failing health. This naturally curtailed his activities and contacts with his people, who, however, were in admiration of his devout priestly character and charitable kindly personality. He left Lima in 1934.

The present pastor, Rev. John M. Ball, was appointed by Archbishop Edward Mooney in August, 1934.

Through all the years the people have been universally loyal and devoted. They have given to this and other communities examples of the ideal Catholic layman. It is only through their generosity, their fine appreciation of Christian values, their full hearted and continual support, and their firm adhering to the principals of Catholic faith that St. Rose's parish is what it is today — one of the foremost parishes of the diocese in every respect.
