### Thomas Muckle Rites Concluded At Stanley

Funeral of Thomas Muckle of Stanley, N. Y., who died in his 53rd year at the family home in Stanley on Nov. 12, was held from 9 to 10 o'clock at St. Theresa's Church, Stanley, on Monday of this week at 10:30 A. M. The Mass was celebrated by Rev. Charles E. Muckle, pastor of St. Agnes Church, Aron, N. Y., assisted by Rev. William D. Muckle, pastor of St. John's Church, New Market, Canada, as officiant, and Rev. Joseph T. Muckle, C.S.B., of St. Michael's College, Toronto, as celebrant, all sons of the deceased.

Rev. Charles J. Sullivan, pastor of St. Thomas's Church, Stanley, was master of ceremonies. Rev. William Naughton, Rector at St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester, and Rev. Edward H. Bell, pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Danville, were acolytes. The choir was composed of friends of the diocese.

Most Rev. James E. Keane, D.D., Bishop of the diocese, gave the final absolution, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Magr. William M. Hart, vicar general and pastor of Corpus Christi Church in Rochester; Rt. Rev. Magr. Charles F. Shay, pastor of Holy Rosary Church, Rochester, and St. Rev. Magr. Joseph Grady, vice-rector of St. Bernard's Seminary, Rochester.

Burial was in St. Michael's Cemetery, Penn Yan, N. Y., where the services were conducted by Rev. Charles Joseph and William Muckle.

The bearers were relatives and associates of Mr. Muckle's from St. Theresa's Church, Stanley, and St. Mary's Church, Rushville, where Mr. Muckle had been a devout member for many years.

Thomas Muckle was born at Middlesex, N. Y., on March 6, 1889, son of John Muckle and Bridget McDermont. He was one of a family of ten children, three of whom still survive, Edward Muckle of Canandaigua, N. Y.; Mrs. Roscoe Fox of Bath, N. Y., and Mrs. Charles Shant of Rushville. Mr. Muckle attended school at Middlesex, N. Y.

He was married Margaret Delaney, a first cousin of Bishop Thomas A. Hendrick, of Cebu, Philippine Islands. Nine children were born, five of whom have given their lives to the service of the Church: Rev. John F. Muckle, St. Thomas Church, Summerville, N. Y.; Rev. Charles Muckle, St. Agnes Church, Aron, N. Y.; Rev. Joseph T. Muckle, C.S.B., of St. Michael's College, Toronto, Canada; Rev. William D. Muckle, St. John's Church, New Market, Canada; and Sister Mary Charles of the Sisters of Mercy, Summerville, N. Y.; Andrew G. Muckle, Stanley, N. Y.; Mrs. Mary McWilliams and Mrs. George C. McWilliams, both of Stanley, N. Y.; Leo A. Muckle, who died at Ithaca in March of this year.

Mr. Muckle is also survived by eight grandchildren of Stanley, N. Y.
