No. 188—Bishop Taylor
 Most Rev. Leo Hale Taylor, S. M. A. Vicar Apostolic of Benin, Nigeria. Born, Sept. 27, 1859, Montevideo, Minn. Joined the Irish Province of the Society of African Missions. Ordained, June 21, 1914, at Cork. On faculty, Seminary for the African Missions, Cork, 1914-20. Supervisor, Catholic Schools of Vicariate of Benin, and president, St. Gregory's College and Normal School, Lagos, Nigeria, West Africa, 1920-34. Named Titular Bishop of Vartana, Feb. 28, 1934, and appointed Vicar Apostolic of Western Nigeria. Consecrated, June 24, 1934, at Asaba, Nigeria. Transferred to Vicariate of the Right of Benin, June 13, 1939, residing at Lagos. Brother of Rev. Claud Taylor, S. M. A. pastor, St. Columba's Church, Cairo, Ill. (N.C.W.C.)
