New York.—Ninth Avenue Federal University students trained in Red Cross first aid and transportation work have been sworn in as a medical unit attached to hospitals in The Bronx.

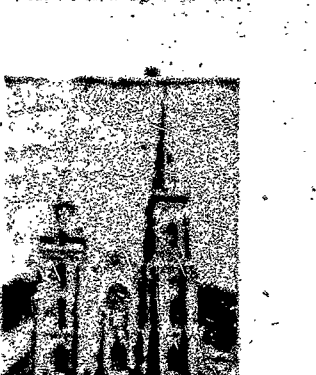
College Returns Old Cannon To Germans Via Scrap Pile
