

### Fordham Professor To Conduct Conferences On Hobart Campus

GENEVA — Rev. Gerald G. Walsh, S. J., Professor of Medieval Culture at Fordham University, will visit the Hobart College campus this week-end for a series of conferences and a public lecture to be given in Cox Hall on Thursday evening.

On Thursday and Friday mornings Nov. 19 and 20, Father Walsh will meet with small groups for conferences. Thursday evening he lectures for the public and students on the topic "Dante as a Medieval Humanist." Friday evening, after dinner at President Potter's residence, he will read a paper on "Dante and the Philosophy of Literature."

Father Walsh received his B. A. in Classics at London University; M. A. in Modern History, Oxford; Ph. D. S. T. D., Gregorian University, Rome, and has received Medals and honors in economics and humanistic studies.

Father Walsh has taught at Woodstock College, Pontifica Universitas Gregoriana at Rome, and now is Professor of Medieval Culture at Fordham University.

### SS. Peter and Paul's Parish

#### SERVICE FLAG DEDICATED

AUBURN — Services were held in SS. Peter and Paul's, Ukrainian Catholic Church on Sunday afternoon in honor of the boys of the parish who are serving with Uncle Sam. A large Service Flag in honor of the 120 or more young men in the Armed Forces was dedicated on Sunday afternoon. The speaker for the occasion was Rev. John J. Scanlon, S.J. of Buffalo.

Father Scanlon is a native of Syracuse and is conducting a mission at St. John the Baptist Church in that city at the present time. He was a young boy when St. John the Baptist Church was dedicated by Bishop Soter S. Orlynsky. After two years at Holy Cross, he entered the Jesuit order on August 15, 1916. He went abroad in 1924 after completing philosophical studies at Woodstock College. He taught for a time at Fordham University and was ordained to the priesthood at Salisbury. He spent a year in Florence, Italy and was later assigned to mission work in Southern Maryland. Father Scanlon was sent to the Pontifical Oriental Institute in Rome in 1931 and was assigned to the new American College in Baghdad, Iraq in 1933 by the Jesuit General. He has taught Oriental languages and theology at Woodstock, Md. and is now engaged in

Father Scanlon spoke in English and Father Lysiak also delivered a sermon in Ukrainian. Solemn Benediction was celebrated following the sermon and those taking part were Rev. Michael Kuxiv, pastor of St. John the Baptist Church, Syracuse; Rev. Michael Lysiak, pastor of SS. Peter and Paul's; Rev. Bernard C. Newcomb, assistant pastor of St. Francis d'Assisi Church.

The choir was under the direction of Prof. Constantine Orlyk and sang the chants of the ancient Byzantine liturgy for the dedication of the military emblem. Four soldiers from the parish, home on furlough, held the flags during the ceremony, assisted by four children of the parochial school. Two young men of the parish have already given their lives for their country. Private George Berzantich, submarine radioman lost his life in the South Pacific and Private John Suchan, also a navy radioman, lost his life in the Atlantic.

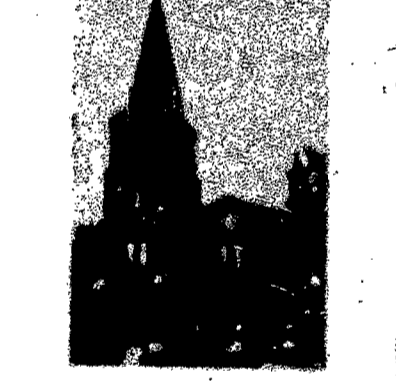
