

South China.
The section of China in which Father Hilbert is working has so far been largely spared the rav-ages of war. There have been several minor bombings but no invasion of this peaceful farming coun-try has yet been attempted by the Japanese. The main difficulties at present are the scarcity of foreign commodities and inflation prices now prevalent in China.
