Among the reports received at the Directors Meeting which could not be read for lack of time, was that of a great amount of service done for St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, by groups from St. Patrick's, St. Mary's, St. John's and St. Peter and Paul's, Elmira.

Red Cross Sewing by the C. D. A. Group in Elmira amounted to 304 hours, besides many unlisted items.

The Sodality Red Cross report also included sewing done for St. Joseph's Hospital, 424 sheets, 256 towels and 33 T. binders.

Miss Mary Leary submitted interesting reports on the Rosary and Scapular Society, and on the Elmira Community Motion Picture Council.

"The Shrine need not be expensive nor elaborate, in fact, many quite simple ones are made by the use of a tiny statue, a picture of the Sacred Heart, a Crucifix and one or two votive lights. Always we have found the inspiration of these Shrines outstanding. To those of you who live in

areas unaffected by the dimout, may we strongly urge the use this year of the Madonna and Child, or the Christ Child in His Crib in your outdoor Christmas decorations. Of late years in our western cities the incorporating of these holy figures has grown extensively in our Christmas Tree Lanes, both by Catholics and non-Catholics. Alas! this year most of our outdoor illuminations will be restricted if not entirely forbidden; but surely in the hearts of the Faithful and in their homes, devotions to the Divine Infant and His beloved Mother will still reign paramountly.

"Just a word about your Christmas cards. Those issued by our Catholic institutions and publishing houses this year are beautiful and in every way combine Christmas greeting with a message honoring the Prince of Peace, invoking in most cases His blessing upon the recipient. Please remember this when choosing your cards, and help to make this custom a permanent one.

"In conclusion the words of Our Saviour are the answer to family prayers, 'Where there are two or three gathered together in My Name there I am in the midst of you.'"

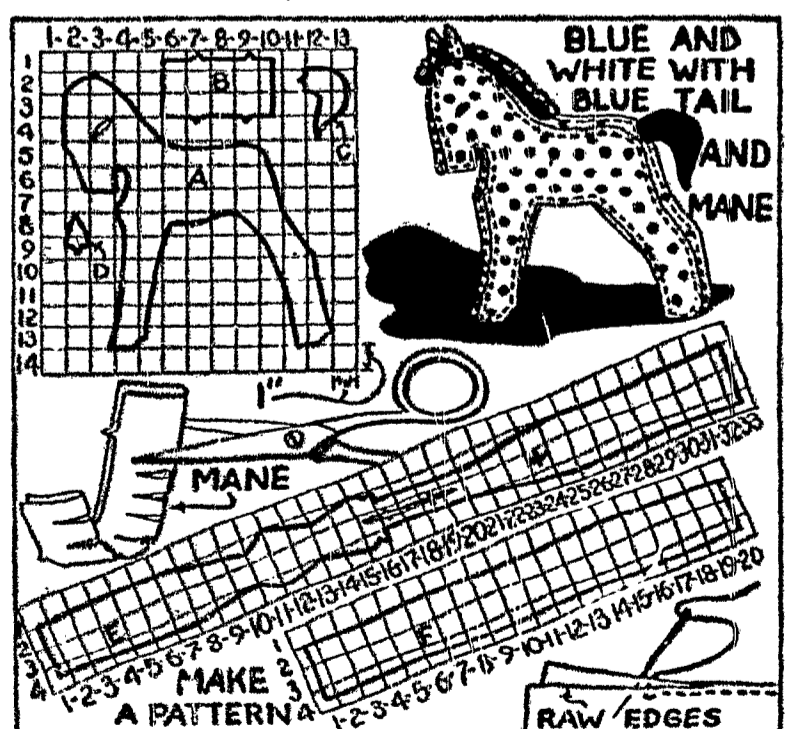

# ON THE HOME FRONT With RUTH WYETH SPEARS

A WASHABLE PONY By Ruth Wyeth Spears



This pony is made of oil cloth and stuffed with cotton or bits of soft cloth. To make a pattern, rule paper into 1-inch squares, number them; then draw pattern outlines. The pattern for the body is shown at A, the mane at B, tail C, ears D. The strip E joins the two sides of the body. The openings are for mane and tail. The projections show where ears are sewn. Cut two pieces for each ear, and the tail, sew together, padding slightly. Strip F is for bottoms of feet; and under part of body and legs. The raw edges are sewn together on the right side is at the lower right, with heavy thread to match tail and mane.
