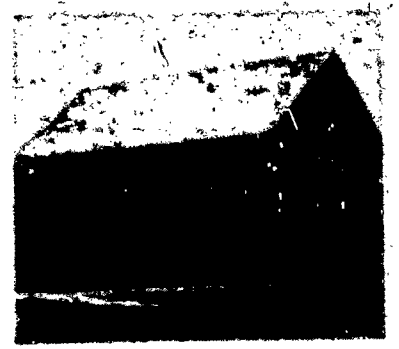


150 Jubilee Masses

Consular officials, distinguished citizens, and commercial representatives of the Latin-American countries attended the ceremony, presided over by the Rt. Rev. Mgr. John Cawley, Vicar General, acting in behalf of the Most Rev. John J. Cantwell, Archbishop of Los Angeles.
