#### Dr. Johnson Elevated

Raised to the rank of Domestic Prelate with the Title of Right Reverend Monsigner was the Rev George Johnson Director of Department of Education of the National Catholic Welfare Conference who studied for the priesthood at St. Bernard's and the North American College in Rome and was ordained on June 6, 1914. Doctor Johnson has often visited Rochester and spoke at the Diocesan Teachers' Conference here on Sept. 13, 1940.

Edward F Hoban as Ordinary of the Diocese of Rockford now joins these other members of his class at St. Bernard's Seminary in the Hierarchy the Most Rev. Matthew F. Brady. Bishop of Burlington, Vt.; the Most Rev. Walter A. Foory, Eistop of Syracuse; the Most Rev. Francis P. Keough, Bishop of Providence and the Most Rev. Emmett M. Walsh, Bishop of Charleston, S. C.

In addition to serving as Viesr General of the Diocese of Des Moines, Bishop Boylan has been president of Dowling College, Des Moines, since 1923.
