

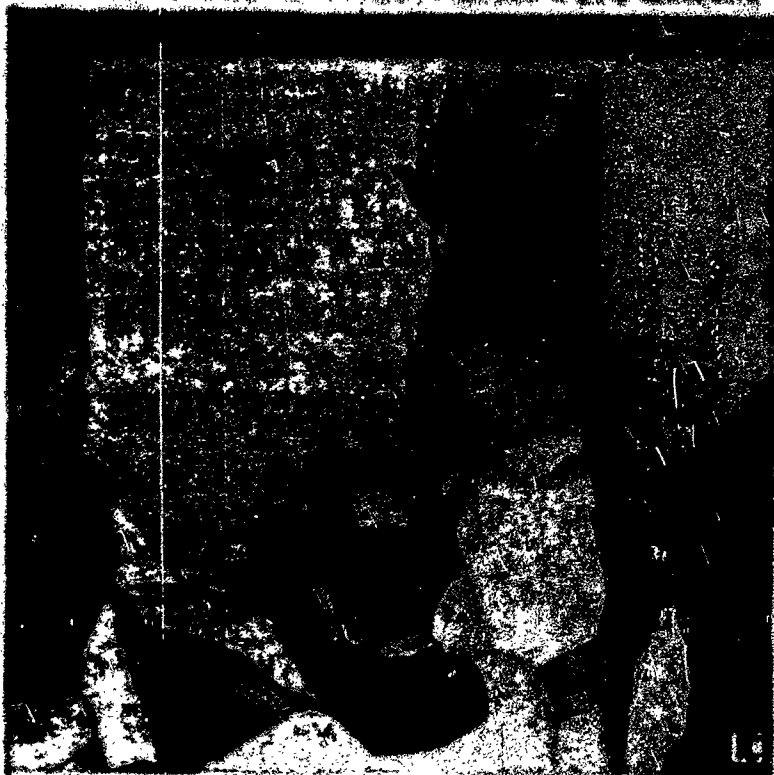

Fr. Stemmler's Anniversary

On Thursday, Dec. 3, Father Stemmler, quietly observed the fifty second anniversary of his ordination. Because of his serious illness, there was no celebration.

Father Stemmler was born in Germany in September 1865, and, in baptism, was given the name of the Saint who is patron of the church of which he was pastor for thirty-nine years. After studying for the priesthood in the diocese of Limber, Germany, Father Stemmler was ordained at Mainz on December 3, 1890. He came to Buffalo in April, 1891 and after serving in different parishes throughout the Buffalo Diocese, came to Elmira in 1903.

In December 1940 Father Stemmler's parishioners and countless friends throughout the city, joined him in celebrating his golden jubilee. The anniversary was marked with a pontifical High Mass celebrated by Bishop Kearney.

In June of this year his failing

health forced him to retire, and he was named Pastor Emeritus. Although no longer on the scene, his church and parishioners, whom he served for so many years, are always first in his thought.


