NEW YORK. Compulsory publication of certain government notices by newspapers and periodicals in a form prescribed by the government was decreed in Nazi-dominated Hungary, the Hungarian newspaper *Poster Lloyd's* reports, according to a shortwave broadcast heard here.

The decree was published in the *Official Gazette*, the newspaper reports, and specifies that government notices must be published without alterations, in essence, under a specific heading.

CHICAGO. The Nazis have suppressed the Catholic Federation of the Americas, a Catholic federation based upon the principles of the suppressed *Opus Dei*, according to news received here by the *Catholic Herald*, National Council of America.

The decree of suppression, it is said, was issued by the Nazi Deputy Commissioner Kurt Daluege. The *Opus Dei* property has also been confiscated.

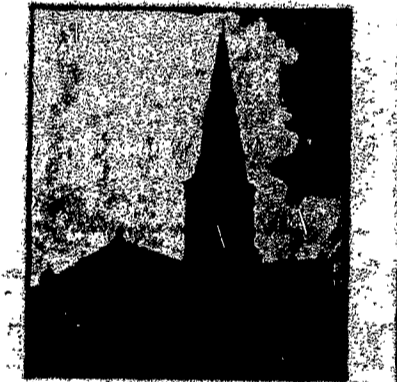

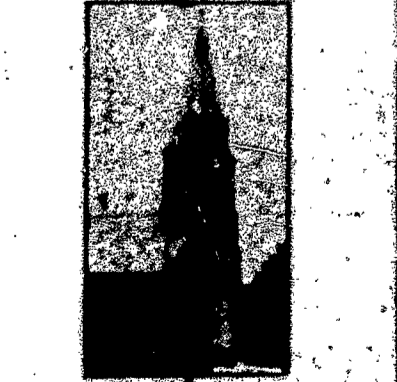
