OTTAWA (NC) In order to protest soldiers from hesty mar riages, the Canadian Army has to aued strict orders regarding mur Plage

Officers below the tank of captain and all warrant officers under the age of 20 must obtain written perbussion of their commanding officer before marrying

Commanding officers any grant permission to non-commissioned officers and men if the noidler is free from debt and realizes the financial responsibilities and the moral character and disposition of the intended wife are such that it would in no way be undesirable for her to accupy public quarters.

If a soldier is under the age of 19 years he must produce the written permission of his parents or guardian, and if the intensed wife under 18 she must have similar noteelitred pertitation
