The National Catholic School of Social Service, has through its very existence for the past 21 years, been the instrument of developing Catholic thought and activity in the field of Social Service. Eighty-three young women received training during the past year. Graduates of the school are and have been filling important needs in government, community and private agencies.

The School plant has also been made available to the National Catholic Community Service for its institutes and the general training of Club Directors and other personnel.

Funeral Rites Set For Sister of St. Joseph

Sister Philip Marie Yawman, Sister Philip Marie Yawman of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph and sister of Miss Cecelia M. Yawman, president of Rochester Diocesan Council, National Council of Catholic Woman died Wednesday, Dec. 16, 1942.

Funeral services for Sister Philip Marie who was in the 31st year of her religious life will be held at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford, at 9 A. M., Saturday, Dec. 19. Burial will be in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.

Sister Philip Marie, a daughter of the late Philip H. and Mary C. Yawman of Rochester, entered the Congregation in 1911. For several years she was a teacher in the Grammar Department of Nazareth Academy. Since 1923 she had been an assistant at St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira.

Besides her sister, Cecelia, she is survived by four other sisters, Aloysia Yawman, Mrs. Henry Heisler and Mrs. Frank W. Hahn, Rochester, and Sister Gabriel de St. Rose of the Little Sisters of the Poor, Germantown, Pa., and a brother, Victor Yawman of Rochester.

Life of Bl. Virgin Cited in 'Joy of Housework' Pastoral

LONDON Writing of the "joy of housework" in his advent pastoral letter the Bishop of Middlesbrough, the Most Rev. T. Shine says "Mary never made a public speech; she never sat on a committee, she was never a member of any political or civic body, no, she, the Mother of God, the seat of wisdom and the cause of our joy, spent her life doing housework, looking after her home and her child that is the history of her life."

Adds the Bishop: "How she now sighs and grieves at the snobbish vanity that detects inferiority in work that was sanctified by Mary's hands."

CURFEW FOR GIRLS URGED BY AUSTRALIAN PRELATE

MELBOURNE. — A curfew for girls, as necessary for preservation from moral dangers, was urged by the Most Rev. James Debig, Archbishop of Brisbane, preaching in St. Stephen's Cathedral there. The Archbishop also said he considered Governmental allowances to de facto wives and widows as scandalous. "Past governments," he said, "gave us Godless education, and today we reap the bitter fruits. But the Church will never lower her standard of teaching in morals."
