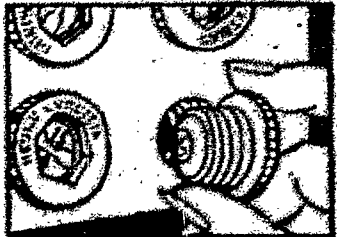
## HOW TO CHANGE a FUSE EASILY and QUICKLY



1—Find main switch at your meter box. Stand on dry surface and turn off electricity.



2—Remove "blown-out" fuse, touching only the top. You can tell it by the burned spot in fuse window.



3—Replace with one of the same size which is clearly marked on fuse, follows main switch.



4—Always keep extra fuses on hand. They cost little. Get one derigister approved fuses from your electrical dealer.

IF A FUSE BLOWS, don't worry, and don't sit around in the dark. A fuse is a safety device to protect your wiring and appliances. If it "blows out" it may be because of a frayed or defective, or faulty appliance. Trace the cause and disconnect the appliance.

Replacing the fuse is as simple as replacing a burned out light bulb (see pictures and captions above). Keep extra fuses on hand and be sure to have defective cord or appliance repaired before placing it back in service.
