

## Bishop's Midnight Holy Hour To Usher In New Year

### New Year's Eve Rites Listed At Cathedral; Reception Set Jan. 3

A world chastened by conflict and strife, diminished and hardships will enter a New Year in more serene vein than in many years.

In the Diocese of Rochester the Holy Hour at Sacred Heart Cathedral, conducted by His Excellency Bishop Kearney, will give opportunity to many in the Rochester area to welcome the New Year with prayers of hope and petitions for the peace that can only come from Almighty God.

Beginning at 11:30 P. M. on Thursday the services in the Cathedral will consist of adoration before the Blessed Sacrament exposed and a liturgy in the Latin. Appropriate hymns will be sung and priests of the Cathedral will join in singing of the Preface.

As midnight approaches the lights will be put out and there will be a minute of silent meditation.

Special prayers will be offered for the restoration of world peace, for the welfare of American boys in the armies and for all others undergoing hardships as a result of the tyranny of men.

His Excellency will be at home to the people of Rochester to extend his New Year's greetings on Sunday, Jan. 3, at the episcopal residence, 941 East Ave.

As has been customary from 1 to 6 P. M., His Excellency will receive visitors which in past years have formed a cross section of the citizens of Rochester.

### Nativity Scene Reenacted In Pageant At Cathedral

In preparation for the Holy Feast of Christmas, the annual Christmas Pageant arranged by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, was impressively conducted in Sacred Heart Cathedral last Sunday evening.

With the Bishop at the episcopal throne the services commemorating in a graphic manner the Birth of the Saviour were solemnly carried out by assisting clergy, children of Sacred Heart School and the Cathedral Men's Choir.

Assisting His Excellency were Assistant Priest, Monignor Burns, Deacon, the Rev. Joseph J. Sullivan, Subdeacon, the Rev. John F. Hayes, Master of Ceremonies, the Rev. John T. Callahan, and the Rev. Alphonsus P. Crummena.

Father Sullivan sang the Christmas Gospel and the English translation was read by the Rev. Thomas W. Tobin, C.S.S.R., of Our Lady of the Lake Diocesan Retreat House, who preached the sermon, Duty of Subjects.

The Kingship of Christ does not get the consideration from His Kingdom which it should, Father Tobin declared and cited the Scriptures and Prophecy which emphasize this Kingship.

Father Tobin explained the duties of a king are care and consideration for his people, while the duties of a subject are fidelity, loyalty and devotion.

"As subjects, we should give all of our fidelity, loyalty and devotion to the New Born King," the Redemptorist Father asserted.

With one of their number attired as the Blessed Mother and bearing the infant, the school children attired as angels, entered the Cathedral and proceeded to the sanctuary where, as the infant was placed in the crib, a striking tableau depicted the adoration of the angels of the Babe of Bethlehem. The lights of the Cathedral were put out and a spotlight was focused on the manger as the faithful knelt to adore the New Born Child Jesus.

Appropriate hymns were sung by the Cathedral Men's Choir directed by Raymond J. Hosenauer, with Mrs. Mary Burns at the organ. The congregation joined in the Christmas hymns.
