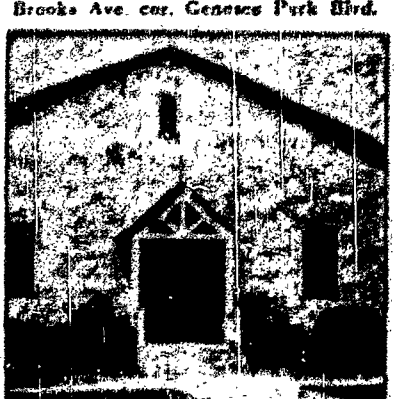

GENEVA. The funeral of Roger Hogan, Sr., formerly of Geneva, who died at his home in Larchmont, N. Y., on Thursday, Dec. 17, was held on Saturday morning at 9 o'clock from the home of Miss Mary Coughlin of North Main Street and at 9 o'clock from St. Francis de Sales Church. Rt. Rev. Msgr. Walter J. Lee, V.F., officiated at the requiem mass. Mr. Hogan was at one time superintendent of the Summit Stove Works in Geneva and was prominent in civic affairs. He is survived by his wife, two daughters, the Misses Margaret and Katherine Hogan of Larchmont; three sons, Roger, Jr., of Rochester, and Joseph and Frank of New York City. Burial was in St. Patrick's Cemetery.

Amazing Amount of \$1275 In War Bonds Bought By Industrious Student

GENEVA. Jeremiah Coughlin of 10 Goodelle Terrace amazed his fellow-students at DeSales High School recently by stating that he wished to purchase seventeen \$100 war bonds, a cash investment of \$1,700. Salesmen in the school campaign to sell war stamps and bonds gasped and then realized that Jeremiah was in earnest. He really did want to purchase that number of bonds. So they got right down to business.

"Yes, sir, Jeremiah," said a salesman, as he began to make the necessary records, "Yes, sir." Students at the school have been highly successful to date in their sales campaign but Jeremiah's contribution caused the committee to beam delightedly at their patriotic fellow student. This would swell the total considerably.
