The record of sales from November 1st to December 10th in each of the schools was as follows: De Sales High School, \$2,172.35; Geneva High School, \$1,531.25; St. Stephen's School, \$1,472.50; Prospect Avenue School, \$942.70; North Street School, \$730.45; Cortland Street School, \$444.35; High Street School, \$362.15; Junior School, \$230.20; St. Francis de Sales School, \$230.00.

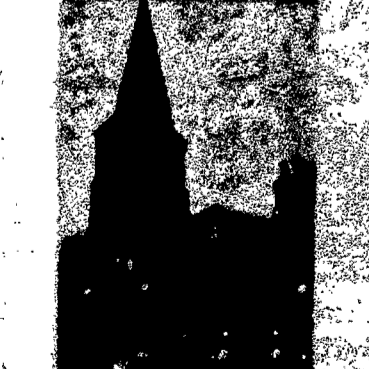
