M. in the Auditorium of Mercy High School. There the Trapp Family Singers will present their famous Yuletide Concert under the direction of Dr. Franz Werndl.

This choir is made up of eight members of the family, Johanna and Agathe Von Trapp, soprano and mezzo soprano, Hedwig Von Trapp and the Baroness Maria Von Trapp, Contraltos; Werner Von Trapp, Tenor, and Dr. Rupert Von Trapp, Bass. The Trapp Family offered their first concert in the United States in Town Hall, Dec. 10, 1938. In four short years their fame has swept the country from coast to coast.
