REQUIEM MILITARY MASS FOR LT. ARTHUR O'CONNOR

The war has come very close to Corpus Christi Parish with the announcement last week of the death of Lieutenant Arthur Joseph O'Connors. Lieutenant O'Connors is the son of Mrs. Helen O'Connors of 100 Garces Avenue. A young man well known in the parish, Lieutenant O'Connors has been in the service for some months. He was killed while taking part in the invasion of Africa.

In memory of this young man, who represents the heroic service of over 250 young men and women from Corpus Christi parish, a Solemn Requiem High Mass will be offered on next Tuesday at 9:30 in Corpus Christi Church. A full military service is being arranged. Former priests of the parish will be present. The school children

will participate in the Mass. Special seats are being reserved for the members of the parish, who have boys in the service.

An invitation is extended to all who would like to join in this fitting tribute to the first boy from the parish to give his life in this war and to the first Rochesterian killed in the Africa invasion.

Parish Priest Makes Credit Union Pay

SEBET HARBOR, N. H.—Laborers of the priesthood are sufficient to keep the most active of men busy, but the Rev. Father J. Johnson, local parish priest, has found time to head the successful operation of a public credit union and general co-operative unit.

Started originally as a cooperative banking venture only, the union recently expanded to open a cooperative general store, where merchandise of all variety is available to union members. The union and store has the cooperation of the chief local industry, the Halifax Power and Pulp Co. The union recently voted 3 per cent interest to shareholders and a 15 per cent rebate to borrowers.

Polish Priest Dies In Nazi Prison

LONDON.—The death in a Nazi prison of Father Szramek, distinguished Polish priest, is reported in information received here by the Polish Catholic Press Agency KAP. Another priest, it was stated, has been sentenced to ten years of hard labor. He is identified as Canon Matej. Two priests, the information stated, were among 50 Warsaw hostages condemned to death.

He holds the rank of Major. Justice Paige is a member of the board of the Catholic Lawyers' Guild, a founder of the Catholic Interracial Council and the Catholic Laymen's League.

Walsh, C.M., former President of St. John's University, Brooklyn, has been appointed to the newly-organized Commission on Religious Organizations of the National Conference of Christians and Jews. 





Food Value of Your Share of Meat



SHARE THE MEAT
Your Share of 2 1/2 lbs. per week
GRAPH SHOWS HOW MUCH OF YOUR FOOD REQUIREMENTS IS SUPPLIED BY 2 1/2 POUNDS OF MEAT

Any change in the meat share would reduce or increase the above percentages proportionately.

Variety meats (liver, heart, kidney, etc.) are not restricted. Each serving of these meats added to your 2 1/2-lb. weekly share of restricted meats will increase the above percentages about as follows: Calories 1%, protein 3%, phosphorus 2 1/2%, iron 3%, vitamin A 1 1/2%, thiamine 2 1/2%, riboflavin 4%, niacin 7%, vitamin C 1 1/2%.
