THE QUESTION:  
What is the National Catholic  
Rural Life Conference?**

It is an organization of bishops, priests and lay persons dedicated to the economic, social and spiritual interests of the American farmer, which:

Functions as an agency within the Church for the application of the principles of Catholic philosophy to the sphere of agriculture; devotes itself to a study of rural life in all its phases; provides a national forum for the discussion of rural problems.

Contributes to the development of an agrarian literature; maintains friendly contacts with individuals and groups in this and other countries who strive for the improvement of farm conditions.

Proclaims the excellence of agriculture as the most ancient, and one of the most honorable of human occupations—the surest source of individual security and the ground-work of national good order and prosperity.

Holds to the belief that the human person, be he transient or permanent, is a child of God and an heir to Heaven, with claims in justice and charity to life, liberty and the possession of property.

Rejects the false philosophy of the times which fails to recognize that the State exists for the individual, and which violates the essential dignity of the common man in the cities and on the soil in unduly glorifying the social and political organism to the detriment of those it is expected to serve.

Deplores the prevalence of land tenancy in the United States, the sorry status of the share-cropper and the farm laborer, the instability of markets and prices, and the trend toward commercialism in agriculture.

Encourages the introduction of sound cooperative arrangements among farm folk wherein they may meet their ordinary credit needs, and gain a proper control over their buying and selling operations.

Regards the countryside as ideal for the establishment and maintenance of normal home and family life; counsels young people to retain companionship of the plow and the hoe.

Endorses the farm electrification program and the full use of any and all devices which will reduce the burdens of farm women.

Champions the cause of better rural schools and rural school teachership, takes the position that texts, curriculum and classroom instruction must be adjusted to the needs of future farmers if the rural school is to render genuine service.

Appreciates the value of the 4-H Club as the keystone of a most desirable rural youth movement.

Pleads for an extension of facilities for religious education and culture in rural America; for more and better churches; for a more numerous clergy; for a development of the missionary machinery of the Church which will reduce the handicaps of rural isolation.

The totals, compiled by the Rev. J. Roger Lyons, S.J., of The Queen's Work here, national sodality secretariate, were contained in a cablegram sent to Vatican City.
