



**A PROTESTANT ANSWERS
THE QUESTION:**
What is the National Catholic
Rural Life Conference?

It is an organization of business
men and lay persons dedicated
to the economic, social and spiritual
interests of the American farmer.

Functions as an agency within
the Church for the application of
the principles of Catholic philosophy
in the sphere of agriculture.
Devotes itself to a study of rural
life in all its phases; provides a
national forum for the discussion
of rural problems.

Contributes to the development
of an agrarian, democratic, ecumenical
friendly contact with individual
and groups in this and other countries who strive for the
improvement of rural conditions.
Proclaims the excellence of agriculture
as the most ancient, and one of the most honorable of
human occupations—the surest source of
individual security and the
ground-work of national and
world peace and prosperity.

Holds to the belief that the
human person, be he peasant or
rancher, is a child of God and an
heir to Heaven, whose cause in
justice and charity is life, liberty
and the possession of property.
CONTRACTS UNKNOWN

Resists the false philosophy of
the times which fails to recognize
that the State exists for the individual,
and which violates the essential
dignity of the common man
in the cities and on the soil by
daily glorifying the social and political
organization to the detriment
of those it is expected to serve.

Deplores the prevalence of land
tenancy in the United States, the
sovereign status of the share-cropper
and the term laborer, the instability
of markets and prices, and the
trend toward commercialism in agriculture.

Encourages the introduction of
sound cooperative arrangements
among farm folk wherever they
may meet their ordinary credit
needs, and gain a proper control
over their buying and selling opera-
tions.

Regards the countryside as ideal
for the establishment and main-
tenance of normal home and family
life; counsels young people to re-
tain companionship of the plow
and the hoe.

Endorses the farm electrification
program and the full use of any
and all devices which will reduce
the burdens of farm women.

Champions the cause of rural
schools and rural school
teachership, takes the position that
texts, curriculum, and classroom
instruction must be adjusted to the
needs of future farmers if the
rural school is to render genuine
service.

Appreciates the value of the 4-H
Club as the keystone of a most de-
sirable rural youth movement.

Pleads for an extension of fa-
cilities for religious education and
culture in rural America; for more
and better churches; for a more
numerous clergy; for a develop-
ment of the missionary machinery
of the Church which will reduce
the handicaps of rural isolation.
