Donations of Athletic, Band Equipment for War Prisoners Strongly Urged

A concerted effort to collect musical instruments and athletic equipment that can be sent to servicemen in war prison camps all over the world will be undertaken shortly.

In Rochester, Herbert P. Lonsdale, Jr., general secretary of the Y. M. C. A., stated yesterday:

Householders are asked to scan their attics, cellars and storerooms while taking January inventory and digging up their old banjos, violins, baseball bats, tennis rackets, ice skates, or any other athletic goods or musical instruments that they may have that can be used by war prisoners.

Almost six million men are now interned behind barbed wire enclosures, who must spend their time in monotonous idleness, unless provided with the means for keeping physically fit, and for entertaining themselves and their fellow prisoners.

One shipment of these materials has already been sent to American war prisoners in the Far East on

the diplomatic ship Gripsholm which left the United States a short time ago.

Obituary in February

Ever since last fall representatives of Rochester theaters, radio stations, newspapers and industries have been cooperating with the Y. M. C. A. and the War Prisoners' Aid Committee to map Rochester, along with Pittsburgh and New Haven, has been selected as a test city to determine the amount of equipment that can be collected and re-conditioned for the use of War Prisoners before a nation-wide effort takes place.

The Y. M. C. A. and the International Red Cross are the only organizations allowed to enter prisoner of war camps all over the world to minister to the needs of prisoners.

The Red Cross is charged with the housing, health and communications of prisoners. The Y. M. C. A. cares for the recreational, spiritual, physical and educational needs of these men.

In order to facilitate the collection of the materials needed, a downtown headquarters will be established shortly where they can be deposited, or they can be taken to any branch of the Y. M. C. A. in the city.

"If you have an old banjo, violin, boxing gloves, catcher's glove, or hockey stick that you would like to contribute, but cannot get to one of the places designated as plans for the collection of these materials which will culminate the week of Feb. 1-7.

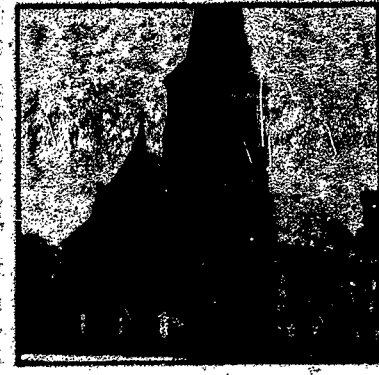
