

Ukrainian Catholics Open Rites Noting Nativity

While their native land is being ravaged by relentless war, Ukrainian Catholics throughout the United States gather (today) Thursday, Jan. 7, to celebrate Christmas. Over four

hundred families of Ukrainian descent are settled in Rochester and the surrounding vicinity.

These Ukrainian Catholics still adhere in their liturgical services to the Julian Calendar founded by Julius Caesar in the year 46 B. C. which is thirteen days behind the Gregorian Calendar in common usage throughout the world.

On Wednesday, Christmas Eve, candles burned in the windows of Ukrainian homes and a twelve-course feast, without meat, symbolic of the twelve apostles who followed the Christ Child born in the manger, was served upon the table strewn with wheat and straw.

Within the church was a miniature of the Bethlehem scene displaying the shepherds, the kings, and the angels adoring the Christ Child.

Singing of Christmas Carols in the church and later by carolers made up of children of the parish school visiting Ukrainian homes portrayed the national joy and happiness among the people of this yuletide spirit.

In St. Joseph's Ukrainian Catholic Church on Hudson Avenue, of which the Rev. Basil Turula is pastor and the Rev. Joseph M. Schmondik assistant pastor, services began on Wednesday, Christmas Eve at 10:30 with Povechije (Post-Vespers); this was immediately followed by a High Mass at about midnight.

On Christmas day another High Mass was celebrated at 10 o'clock. Accordingly New Year's Day for Ukrainians comes on Jan. 14.

Training War Workers By Thousands Planned

With new demands for trained workers, the Vocational Training for War Production program, now operating in ten high schools in the Rochester area, is making preparations to tackle the big job of training thousands on a "mass training for mass production" scale, Verne A. Bird, Assistant Superintendent of Schools and War Training Director, announced.

For the past two months, the number of trainees has declined sharply until the past week when an increase was noted. This was reported by Director Bird who said that the number taking courses has decreased from a peak figure, with the exception of the month of December and the first few days of January, 1943, which showed increases.

"At least 19,000 persons, mostly women, will be needed during the coming year," he said.

2,000 Take Courses

Another 2,000 already at work are taking, in their off time, supplementary training courses offered by the public schools war training program to give them new or added skills.

Mr. Bird said that enrollments for pre-employment training "have not yet reached the high points that should be attained in an area like Rochester which is listed as a locality where labor shortages obviously exist," although those taking the short-term courses "will get jobs more quickly at higher wages" than untrained new workers.

Director Bird issued an appeal to war plant employers urging them to take advantage of the vast vocational training facilities of the public schools. He explained that personnel offices of war plants should refer inexperienced and unskilled labor to the war training program for short term courses.

This, he said, in the final analysis will serve a worthwhile purpose in keeping a steady stream of trained workers flowing into war plants, thus helping to curb labor shortages.

With the addition of new equipment, the Vocational Training for War Production Schools in the Rochester area are established to handle a peak load of nearly 6,000 trainees a day, on a 24-hour round the clock basis. All inquiries can be directed by calling Main 2900, extension 22.
