SODALITIES SET SUPPER

The Sodality of Mary of St. Mary's Church will hold their annual covered dish supper on Tuesday evening, Jan. 12, at 6:30 in Lyceum Hall. The entertainment for the evening, in charge of Theresa Dolin and Betty Falvey and the Junior Sodality will present a one-act play. The Seniors have planned a variety entertainment. Miss Jean Callahan and Miss Louise Clampi are co-chairmen and Miss Patricia Robinson will be the toastmistress. Reservations will close on Monday evening. Miss Mary Casey is president of the Senior Sodality and Miss Betty Bradley is president of the Junior Sodality.

Family Communion Sunday

Sunday will be the Feast of the Holy Family. The special devotion which proposes the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph as the model of virtue for all Christian households began in the seventeenth century. It commenced almost simultaneously in Canada and France—the Association of the Holy Family being founded in Montreal in 1643, and the Daughters of the Holy Family in Paris in 1674. Numerous other congregations and associations under the patronage of the Holy Family have been established since that time and they are spread over the world. The arch-confraternity was established by Pius IX in 1847.

In 1893 Leo XIII approved a Feast for Canada and Pope Benedict XV extended the Feast of the Holy Family to the whole church and ordered its celebration to take place on the Sunday within the Octave of the Epiphany or, in anticipation, on Saturday, January 12th, when the Epiphany and its Octave fall on a Sunday.

In the collect of the Mass on the Feast Day we find the following prayer: "O Lord Jesus Christ,

who being subject to Mary and Joseph, didst sanctify home life with unspeakable virtues: grant, that by the aid of both, we may be taught by the example of Thy Holy Family, and attain to eternal fellowship with It." The members of each family in the parish are asked to attend Mass and receive Holy Communion together as a family unit next Sunday morning. The Holy Name Society will not receive Holy Communion in a body but will be at the rail with the other members of their families.

Religious Articles

Religious Articles will be on sale in the vestibule of the Church on Saturday afternoon and evening; on Sunday morning between the Masses and on Wednesday evening before and after the Novena services. The members of the Senior Sodality with Father Hickey directing are in charge of the sale of religious articles.

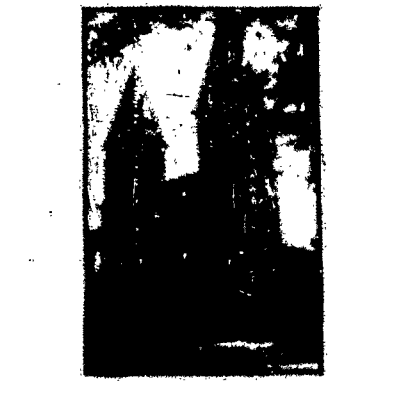

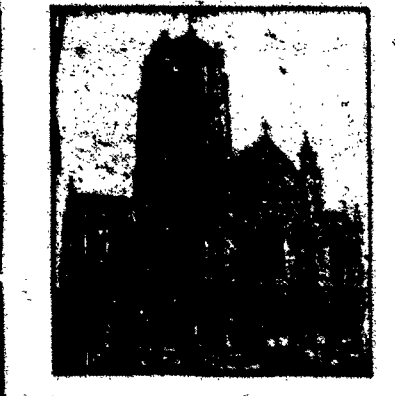
