WASHINGTON — Robert D. Murphy, distinguished Catholic diplomat and former student at Marquette University, Milwaukee, has been given the rank of Minister in the Foreign Service of the United States by President Roosevelt. He has been nominated for the recently won award the Distinguished Service Medal.

Mr. Murphy, who was Consul of the United States Embassy in France at the time of that country's fall, was sent to North Africa when Admiral William D. Leahy was sent to Vichy as Ambassador.
