

NORTH AFRICA HERO HONORED BY PRESIDENT

WASHINGTON -Robert D. Murphy, distinguished Catholic diplomat and former student at Marquette University, Milwaukee, has been given the rank of Minister in the foreign service of the United States by President Roosevelt, it has been announced here. He recently was awarded the Dis-

tinguished Service Medal. of the United States Embassy to France at the time of that country's fall, was sent to North Africa when Admiral William D. Leahy when Admiral William D. Leahy was sent to Vichy as Ambassador, and is credited with creating the favorable scene upon which American troops landed for the liberation of North Africa.
