in His instruction that we must deny ourselves, take up our cross and follow Him.

The Bishop said that we had gathered in the Chapel to render thanks to God in this culmination of the efforts of months. Special thanks were due, he said to the Sisters, Doctors of the Staff and nurses who have worked so courageously and loyally despite the obstacles and difficulties inherent in the old building.

It was their self-sacrifice and devotion which were the greatest factors for success in the fund raising campaign of last year. Because these groups, in the opinion of the Bishop, had devoted themselves so unstintingly to their vocation the public was prepared to duplicate St. Mary's Hospital that they might serve the sick more efficiently.

Bishop Kearney also paid glowing tribute to that great army of workers in the campaign who tramped the streets of the city and from door to door sought gifts both large and small to assist the Sisters in their efforts.

Shortly after 1 o'clock the Bishop and clergy went in procession to the new hospital to bless its corridors and rooms and to seek divine intervention upon the efforts of the doctors and nurses in their care of the sick.

During the afternoon and evening large groups toured the hospital marveling at its magnificence and the efficiency of its new facilities and equipment. Everyone agreed that the efforts of the past months were amply repaid.

The Most Reverend Bishop in his remarks paid tribute to Mr. Flynn and Mr. Meagher particularly. When faced with government restrictions and priorities on essential materials they went on courageously and their devotion to duty was everywhere evident in the new hospital.

The Bishop recalled Mr. Daniel Meagher's statement which seemed to be the guiding motto of all in any way connected with this effort: "It was always with a prayer on my lips and the realization that I was doing nothing for myself but building for God. Because of this success seemed to come where it was least expected."
