appliances for these functions and a three-compartment cork-insulated refrigerator. The kitchens have other refrigerators of varying sizes.

On the ground floor level is also a garbage room taking up an extreme corner of the floor with a large door for ready removal of refuse. At the opposite end are staff dining rooms and a cafeteria of the latest equipment.

22nd From Albany


