As I stood reading the sign, a player, with a long cigarette holder wagging precariously upon his lips, dropped the lighted cigarette from the holder, searched for it a moment, couldn't find it, exclaimed Oh Hammand went on after his ball.

More than once in driving in the woods of the State of Washington or in California I have been stopped by a forest fire and once indeed all but trapped between burning trees in front and behind The rangers declared that almost all such first are set either by campers or eigerette-stub throwers. Nothing can cure them. Newspapers in those see-Nothing can care them. You have in a small way the same phenomenon of carelessness is the home and—the office. There seems to be no means whatever of correcting these criminally careless people. Are they morous? Not any more so than you or I, except along that one line. Are they maliclous? Not at all, Just careless. They "don't give a hang." No psychiatrist has as yet discovered what kind of argument will appear to their peal to them.

I once knew a man of considerable wealth who had a marble bar and floor installed in his beautiful nome. He was a great entertainer, though an some-times happens, a total abstainer. Those recollections and dozens more came back read of the holocaust in that nightin Boston. It is little satisfaction to see in the papers that "an investigation has been commenced." Why do not the investigations commenced. Why do not the investigations commence before the calamity, not after? But there ARE in-spections. Yes? What kind of inspection is it that doesn't prevent catastrophe? Like the lightedmatch and cigorette-stub throwers, like the campers and the drinkers and the rest, inspectors may be carcless. Carelessness in such a matter is crim-inal. 
