**Parish Cooperates**

The members of St. Patrick's Parish cooperated whole-heartedly with the appeal made by Bishop James E. Kearney for a "Family Communion Sunday" on the Feast of the Holy Family. Practically every family approached the Communion rail as a unit and received Holy Communion together. The children of the Parochial School, who ordinarily occupy pews in the front of the church, on this Sunday sat with the members of the family and received Holy Communion with their parents and older brothers and sisters. At the close of the second Mass, the High Mass of the day, Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament was offered for the welfare of the boys of the parish who are in the service of their country and who therefore were unable to be present on this occasion with the other members of their families.

The one main item in the report was the subscriptions paid during the Jubilee celebration during the Summer months. The total amount of pledges already paid now amounts to more than \$6,000 and there are some pledges still unpaid. This magnificent sum of money was used to defray all bills for the redecorations and repairing of the church property in connection with the 100th anniversary of the founding of the Parish.

The receipts for the pew rent increased nearly \$1,000 over those received in 1941. This increase was brought about by a new innovation—those who did not rent pews, paying 10 cents each Sunday for a sitting. Several other sources of revenue also showed an increase over the previous year.

According to the Vital Statistics report there are 190 families in the parish and during the year there were 26 baptisms, 14 marriages, only nine deaths and there were three converts. More than 14,000 Holy Communions were distributed during the year.
