His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester, will Pontificate, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George V. Burns and priests of the Cathedral.

Services at the evening service beginning at 7:45 P. M. will be preached by the Rev. Dr. Maynard Connell of St. Bernard's Seminary faculty.

The virtues of Faith, Hope and Charity were used as a theme by the Bishop in reviewing the work of Catholic women in various fields.

Before him, the Bishop said, he saw representatives of the various charitable and church works of Catholic women and he paid tribute to achievements such as the Nazareth College and St. Mary's Hospital campaigns in which they took a definite part.

The unselfish spirit manifested by the women in their various enterprises of Catholic activity increases the Apostolate of the laity in the eternal quest for the salvation of souls.

A spiritual bouquet of 260 Rosaries was presented to the Bishop in behalf of the Catholic Women's Club.

Urge Women To Aid Scapular Militia Work

Workers Bid To Catholic Labor College Opening

Second semester of Rochester Catholic Labor College will open on Friday evening, Jan. 22, at St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, 402 South Ave., it is announced by the Rev. George E. Vogt, M.A., diocesan director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine.

The course will last seven weeks and will be concerned with the pertinent problems of Post-War Reconstruction. Each session will begin promptly at 8:30 P. M. and will follow the pattern of the last year.

There will be a single lecture by Father Vogt on Labor Ethics followed by an open forum discussion. Father Vogt has chosen for his text a pamphlet by Dom Vergil Michel entitled "Ideals of Reconstruction." This is one of a series on "The Social Question."

Father Vogt announces that Dr. Aaron I. Abell, head of the History Department at Nazareth College with address the Labor College on Friday evening, Jan. 27. Doctor Abell will discuss current legislation regarding capital and labor.

The Catholic Workers' Group conducting St. Joseph's House of Hospitality, sponsors the Rochester Catholic Labor College which they announce is a practical response to our late Holy Father's command: "Go to the workmen, especially where he is poor; and in general, go to the poor."

"We invite everyone concerned with the problems of the laborer to attend the weekly sessions of the Labor College. We urge especially Catholic trade unionists to come and discuss the principles of Catholic Social Action. We invite the workers in war industries to these sessions," leader of the Labor College stated this week.
