BALTIMORE (AP)—The Rev. Frederick J. Nocker, who served for the last three years at St. James' Church here, has been assigned to Fort Benjamin Harrison, Ind. He is the fifth Redemptorist to leave Baltimore for Army duty and the second to go from St. James' parish.

Father Nocker was stationed at St. Joseph's Church, Rochester, and has many friends throughout the diocese where he conducted missions and assisted Sundays at various churches.

### Fr. Staub's Deeds Recalled On 20th Death Anniversary

Life and deeds of Rev. Jacob F. Staub were gratefully recalled at a joint meeting of the Catholic Central Verein of America and the National Catholic Women's Union, Rochester Branches, held last Sunday afternoon at St. Joseph's Hall.

The twentieth anniversary of the death of Father Staub was the occasion of the tributes paid to him. Father Staub died Jan. 15, 1923.

At 11 o'clock both branches attended high Mass at Holy Redeemer Church of which Father Staub had been pastor for more than twenty years. The Mass was offered at the request of the two branches and was celebrated by the Rev. F. William Stauder, present pastor of the church.

At the conclusion of the Mass Father Stauder commended the two organizations on their loyalty to Father Staub. He said that it is well for us to keep fresh the memory of such a man and to review from time to time the lessons which he taught and the principles for which he stood.

He congratulated the two branches on their carrying out the program which Father Staub helped to formulate.

He stated that more persons should realize what is being done by the two branches and should cooperate with them in making better known the Christian principles on the social question.

Outstanding Priest In the afternoon the two branches met at St. Joseph's Hall, where a greater part of the time was spent in narrating the life and deeds of Father Staub and in particular, during those years he

spent with the two branches.

Several of the members of both the men's and women's branches who had been closely associated with Father Staub during his twenty years of activity with the Catholic Central Verein of America recalled the actions which made him "an outstanding priest and a real ambassador of Christ."

Those who spoke were former County Judge Philip H. Donnelly, Louis Ammering, Joseph T. Otto, Anthony Limpert, Rudolph Schwennner, Anthony Kehrige, August M. Maier and Mrs. Madge Spiegel.

Rev. Stephen W. Aulbach, C.S.B., R., spiritual director of the men's branch, addressed the meeting. He said, "I did not have the privilege of knowing Father Staub personally. From what I heard here today, however, and from what I heard from others, I am sure, that he was a wonderful priest, and must have made a deep impression upon your two branches."

Charles J. Miller, Treasurer of Holy Family Parish Credit Union, told the meeting that the directors of that Credit Union had authorized a reduction in the rate of interest to be paid by borrowers. He pointed out that this is a further evidence of the importance of the philosophy back of the parish credit union movement, which is to make it easy for those in difficulty to secure loans at a reasonable rate.
