## National Executive In Auburn To Survey Catholic Troops' Work

AUBURN—Kenneth E. Cook, assistant to the Director of the Division of Operations of the National Council of the Boy Scouts of America came to Auburn on Thursday and spoke to the pastors and assistants of the Catholic Churches concerning Boy Scout work.

Hazen Ross, Scout Executive, announced that Mr. Cook came to Auburn for the purpose of assisting in the development of Scouting in the Catholic Churches.

Mr. Cook has had a wide experience in Scouting and particularly with the Catholic Church. He started as a Scoutmaster at Oak Park, Ill., and later became assistant Scout executive at Quincy, Ill.

During the years 1931 to 1934 he was employed as executive director of the Federation of Catholic Charities in Montreal, where he accomplished a great deal. Mr. Cook received a degree of Bachelor of Arts from the University of Western Ontario, where he majored in Catholic Philosophy and Education at Assumption College of that University. He received a degree of Master of Arts and also a certificate in Boy Guidance following two years of post graduate work at the University of Notre Dame.

While at Assumption College he was president of the Holy Name Society and editor of the college weekly paper. He is a member of the Knights of Columbus and active in the work of the Society of St. Vincent de Paul.

Father O'Brien is an Auburnian, a graduate of St. Mary's Parochial School, Auburn, and of St. Andrew's Seminary, Rochester. He was ordained with the Class of 1935 of St. Bernard's Seminary. He was an assistant pastor at Corpus Christi Church at the time of his enlistment.

## PRELATE URGES RECITATION OF ROSARY DAILY FOR PEACE

SAN ANTONIO.—The Most Rev. Robert E. Lucey, Archbishop of San Antonio, has recommended the daily recitation of the Rosary to the Blessed Virgin "asking her to pray for peace," in compliance with the wishes of His Holiness Pope Pius XII.

Archbishop Lucey particularly emphasized that "the prayers of children are particularly dear to the heart of God," and said: "We trust that the little ones will recite at least a part of the holy Rosary every day, beseeching the Mother of God that an era of peace, of justice and of love may come to this tired world."

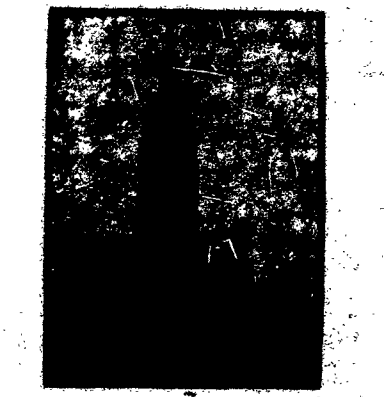
