

Evangelization of Russia Hopeful Believes Writer Citing Faith of People

LISBON.—An article published originally in the Orthodox magazine *Prav-Slavnyaya Rassa of Slovakia*, and signed by P. Perof, has attracted considerable attention because of suggestions made regarding the future evangelization of Russia.

The author, who says his deductions are based on personal contacts with Soviet citizens and Russian prisoners of war in Germany, believes that Bolshevism has never succeeded in effecting the Russian national sentiment which is strongly stamped with orthodox conceptions of the world; and that the new Russia will be built only in the spirit of orthodoxy—an indispensable presupposition of civilization and the Russian State.

As to the current attitude of the Russian people towards religion, P. Perof divides the population into three principal groups of quite different numerical importance. Into the first group, those who have not lost the faith of their fathers, he puts the great mass of the people, particularly the peasants. Anti-religious propaganda, he contends, has never succeeded in penetrating the depths of the Russian national soul.

"The only thing that has been shaken," he writes, "is a naive and primitive faith in religious practices, and the conventional expression of religious sentiment which, too often, is confused with true piety."

The religious foundation of Russia could not be destroyed because—if for no other reason—it is older than orthodoxy itself. Belief in opposing forces of good and

evil and the final victory of good over evil; belief in punishment for all faults on earth here and the recognition of a regulating power beyond human punishes—these have not changed. They formed the original soil on which all the seeds of orthodoxy were sown.
