Servicemen Enroute Overseas To Receive Religious Kits

WASHINGTON.—(NC)—Material means for providing a well-spring of spiritual strength and fortitude for servicemen will be distributed in the form of religious kits as the men leave "staging areas" for service on foreign battlefronts...

Distribution will begin about Jan. 30, after a religious service at Ft. Hamilton, N. Y. Eventually, the kits will be distributed through more than 1,200 USO clubs throughout the country.

Those for distribution to Catholics will contain an illustrated manual, a pocket crucifix, rosary, scapular medal and four pieces of Catholic literature written to inspire servicemen to live up to the ideals of American Catholicism.

The printed material for Catholics includes—besides a military manual—a 48-page booklet, "Teaming Up for God and Country," which develops the theme that a worthy soldier owes a duty to God, to himself and his country...

A pamphlet, "They're Married," by the Rev. Daniel A. Lord, S.J., explains the purpose, sacredness and serious responsibilities of Matrimony and includes a survey of Christian principles that must guide the lives of married persons...

Two leaflets in the kit come from the pen of the Most Rev. John P. O'Hara, C.S.C., Military Delegate. They are titled "Instruction on the Sixth Commandment" and "Advice to Catholic Recruits."

Kits for men now abroad will reach them through various religious channels.

Croix De Guerre Won By French Nun

ZURICH. Sister St. Frederic, one of five nuns of the "Bliss Convent" of Châtres (Tarn) who were mobilized in September 1939, to serve with the French forces, has been cited for heroism and awarded the Croix de Guerre with palms.

Sister St. Frederic and the other nuns saw active service in North-

ern France and Belgium. After the retreat of the French armies, they remained at Châtres to care for the wounded. During a heavy bombardment, while trying to bring the wounded to shelter, Sister St. Frederic was injured seriously and her bravery under fire won her the decoration.

FBI Chief Advocates Religion In Colleges

CHICAGO.—Religion, ethics and crime prevention were among subjects recommended by J. Edgar Hoover, director of the Federal Bureau of Investigation, for a well-rounded curriculum for students. Mr Hoover made his suggestions to the Methodist Board of Education at the request of Dr. Harry Wright McPherson, of Nashville, executive secretary of the board, which has 135 colleges and universities under its jurisdiction.

Religious teachings are naturally included in my suggestions for an education program, regardless of denominational or religious belief," Mr Hoover stated. "I would also suggest that attention be given to the various phases of ethics in public and personal relationships. Included might be a study of the canons of ethics of the various professions, which might serve to instill in students an idea of the importance of a proper relationship to their job, to their fellowmen, to their country and of course to their God."
