446 Churches In Rome Proper

VATICAN CITY.—A remarkable growth in the number of parishes and churches in the City of Rome in little more than a decade is revealed by the 1943 edition of *Black Rome* which has just been published. Rome, R. Dickinson, has 446

churches, 217 chapels and 77 oratories. This does not include the numerous chapels in religious institutions. Neither does this summary include the territory of Vatican City, where there are six churches besides St. Peter's Basilica.

On the initiative of His Holiness Pius XII, the number of parishes in the Eternal City have increased from 41 to 245 since 1928. In the same period 46 churches, 17 chapels and 26 temporary chapels have been built.
