

Evangelization of Russia Hopeful Believes Writer Citing Faith of People

LISBON—An article published originally in the Orthodox magazine Prava-Slavnaya Russia, and signed by P. Perof, has attracted considerable attention because of suggestions made regarding the future evangelization of Russia.

The author, who says his deductions are based on personal contacts with Soviet citizens and Russian prisoners of war in Germany, believes that Bolshevism has never succeeded in effacing the Russian national sentiment which is strongly stamped with orthodox conceptions of the world; and that the new Russia will be built only in the spirit of orthodoxy—an indispensable presupposition of civilization and the Russian State.

As to the current attitude of the Russian people towards religion, P. Perof divides the population into three principal groups of quite different numerical importance. Also the first group, those who have not lost the faith of their fathers, he puts the great mass of the people, particularly the peasants. Anti-religious propaganda, he contends, has never succeeded in penetrating the depths of the Russian national soul.

"The only thing that has been shaken," he writes, "is a naive and primitive faith in religious practices, and the conventional expression of religious sentiment which, too often, is confused with true piety."

"The religious foundation of Russia could not be destroyed because if for no other reason—it is older than orthodoxy itself. Belief in opposing forces of good and

evil and the final victory of good over evil; belief in punishment for all faults on earth itself and the recognition of a regulating power beyond human passions—these have not changed. They formed the original soil on which fell the mustard-seed of orthodoxy."

Appeal For Catholic Paralysis Drive Aid

WASHINGTON.—An appeal for Catholic cooperation in the annual campaign for support of the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis has been made here.

One purpose of the campaign, which is carried out preceding observance of President Franklin D. Roosevelt's birthday on Jan. 30, is to acquaint the people with the continued, urgent necessity of the Foundation's work in behalf of the afflicted and the importance of carrying on important research work against infantile paralysis.

Active Holy Name Unit In Elmira Reformatory

A Holy Name Society with a larger percentage membership than the ordinary parish can count is the boast of Elmira Reformatory—55 to 60% of the Catholic population.

In contrast to similar societies outside the walls, these Holy Name men have no social gatherings, no meetings to decide new projects; there is simply the faithful resolve to attend the Sacraments in honor of the Christ Whose name they honor.

The society, which was originated four years ago, at the time of the opening of St. John Bosco Chapel, recruits new members with surprising ease. The president of the organization is also, at present, clerk for the Rev. Francis J. Lane, chaplain. At the time when new men come for the regulation conference with Father

Lane, the president speaks to them about entering the Holy Name Society.

"These lads, most of them, want to do what's right; they know they've made a mistake and are anxious to set themselves right," said Father Lane. When they are convinced that membership in the Holy Name is one step in that direction, they are glad to join.

When a man becomes a member he is given a certificate which he treasures even when he has left. The number is so large that Communion Sunday comes every Sunday in the month in order to take care of the four groups into which the society is divided. There is a leader for each group, with a president over all. Each Sunday a banner is displayed in the chapel representing the group which made the best showing on the previous Sunday and group competition is keen.

It is heartening to see such eager response in an institution where, at necessity, the society exists entirely in its spiritual significance.
