Rites Held in Owego For Sister Of Mercy

OWEGO.—Sister Mary Catherine, of the congregation of the Sisters of Mercy for more than forty-two years and for the past eight years a member of the faculty of St. Patrick's Parochial School in this village, died on Saturday, Jan. 23, in St. Joseph's Hospital in Elmira where she had been a patient for several months.

Sister Catherine retired from active teaching with the beginning of the school year in September and short time later entered St. Joseph's Hospital for treatment and she had since remained there.

She was born in Williamsport, Pa., and was the daughter of the late Patrick and Catherine Jones Bradley, she being one of twelve children. Sister Mary Catherine was the second daughter of the family to enter the religious life, an older sister being a member of the Immaculate Heart of Mary Order of Scranton, Pa. and known as Sister Mary Scholastica.

During her many years spent in the classrooms of the parochial schools of the diocese which included the schools in Hornell, Elmira, Corning, Rochester and Clyde, Sister Mary Catherine had had great influence for the betterment of those who came under her charge, both spiritually and academically. In her death a teacher and advisor has been removed from the Rochester diocese whom it will be difficult to replace.

The funeral was held on Tuesday morning at 10 o'clock in St. Patrick's Church.

Among the survivors are three sisters, Mrs. J. H. McGuire of Chicago, Ill., Mrs. D. M. Gerry, of Williamsport, Pa., and Mrs. G. H. Stoetzel, of Detroit, Mich., two brothers, Louis J. Bradley and P. X. Bradley both of Detroit. The Rev. John F. Bradley, of Ypsilanti, Mich., is a nephew. There are eight nephews who are in the Armed Forces of the United States and several nieces.

St. Patrick's School was closed on Monday and Tuesday honoring the memory of St. Catherine. The pupils attended the funeral on Tuesday morning as a unit.
