### BRITON WHO SOUGHT REFUGE IN VATICAN EXCHANGED FOR ITALIAN PRISONER

VATICAN CITY.—Albert Penny, a Petty Officer in the British Navy, who escaped from an Italian prison camp several weeks ago and took refuge in Vatican City, has been exchanged for Mario Trevianni, a Petty Officer of the Italian Navy, who was a prisoner in England. Both men belong to the submarine service.

The exchange, which was made with the consent of both the Rome and London Governments, took place in Lisbon. Petty Officer Penny went to Lisbon in the company of a private of the Vatican Secretariat of State.

LONDON.—Stories have reached here of a British soldier—his name is given as Penny—who escaped from an Italian prison camp and made his way to Vatican City, where he asked to see the Pope, and who has been housed in Vatican City awaiting exchange for an Italian prisoner.

The soldier is reported to have escaped from the Italian prison camp at Ventralia, and to have made his way to Vatican City after removing all identifying marks from his clothing.

Some authorities here said that since Vatican City is a neutral State, the normal procedure would be to intern the English soldier. They immediately pointed out, however, that it would entail a great deal of difficulty for the Vatican to set up a special camp for one soldier. Some reports said the soldier had sought "sanctuary," but it is believed here that this does not enter into the present case, but that it is simply a matter of a helligerent walking into neutral territory.

It is said in London that His Holiness Pope Pius XII has suggested that the man be exchanged for an Italian soldier of corresponding rank held prisoner by the British.

### Special Edition New Testament Authorized To Aid Armed Forces

WASHINGTON.—Issuance of a de luxe edition of the revised New Testament, limited to 1,000 copies, as a special collector's item has been authorized by the Most Rev. Edwin V. O'Hara, Bishop of Kansas City and chairman of the Episcopal Committee of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine. It was announced at the Confraternity headquarters here. Proceeds from the sale of the edition will be used to supply religious literature to men in the armed forces.

A committee of well known laymen, all Papal Knights, has undertaken to call the special edition to the attention of collectors and laymen throughout the country. Reports from Army and Navy Chaplains indicated a pronounced response on the part of men, especially those in war zones, to possess copies of the New Testament.

QUEBEC.—His Eminence Rodrigue Cardinal Villeneuve, Archbishop of Quebec, paid an official New Year's visit to the Legislative buildings here and was received by Premier Adolphe Godbout and members of the Provincial Cabinet. Accompanying the Cardinal were the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Camille Roy, Rector of Laval University and Vicar General of the diocese, and Very Rev. Canon Edgar Chouinard.

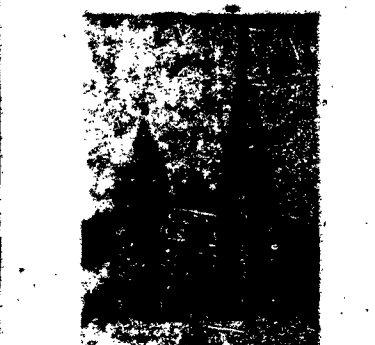

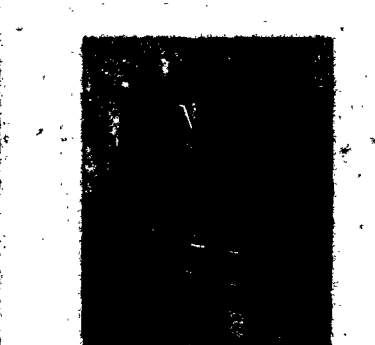
