

Culture Lectures Move To Chamber Of Commerce Feb. 7

Sheed And Ward Joint Lecture-Forum Starts At 8 P.M. On Sunday

Remaining events in the Christian Culture Lecture Series will be held in the Chamber of Commerce, 81 Paul St. near Main. A poll of the patrons and subscribers to the series showed an overwhelming choice for a downtown location due to transportation difficulties. The earlier starting time of 8:00 P. M. has been decided upon as well.

The first event in the new setting is next Sunday's (Feb. 7) joint lecture-forum by Sheed and Ward. Francis J. Sheed returns to the series after his famous lecture on "The New Apologetic" given last year. His wife, known in the literary world as Marie Ward, appears for the first time in the series.

Mr. and Mrs. Sheed comprise the publishing firm of London and New York, Sheed and Ward. Together they have made a real effort to present the truths of Christianity positively. Marie Ward is the author of "Insurrection vs. Resurrection," "This Burning Heat," and "The Wilfred Wards and The Transation." The latter is a two-volume biography of her parents. It is also a history of fifty years of English Catholicism. Mrs. Chesterton has entrusted her with the writing of the biography of G. K. Chesterton.

Many regard the Sheeds as the spearheads of the Catholic revival in the English-speaking world in recent years. Mr. Bernard E. Pinocchio will preside at Sunday's lecture. The title will be "Personality." Last year's hearers of Mr. Sheed's question period following the lecture rated his handling of questions as most masterful. A similar period will follow Sunday night's event in which Marie Ward will also take part.

India City Prohibits Birth Control Clinics

BOMBAY The City Corporation has rejected by an overwhelming vote the proposal that two part-time birth control clinics be opened in connection with dispensaries here. The sole Catholic member and all the Muslim members of the corporation voted against the proposal. Dr. Abbas D'Souza, a Catholic, appealed to the city corporation not to endorse any project which would in any way tend to the lowering of public morality.

Bishop Comforts Mothers At Mass-For Service Sons

The world of the spirit is such a real thing that "we are closely united to our boys in the services in our prayers regardless of separations."

This comforting message was given to a capacity congregation of mothers and other relatives of boys and girls in the armed forces by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney at Holy Mass celebrated by the Bishop in St. Joseph's Church, Friday morning, Jan. 29. The Mass for mothers of servicemen is offered periodically by the Bishop for their intentions.

His Excellency was assisted at the Mass by the Rev. Lawrence B. Casey. In the Sanctuary also were the Rev. Louis Braunmann, C.S.S.R. and the Rev. Matthew Weber, C.S.S.R. of St. Joseph's Church. Citing the Divine Saviour's promise that "where two or more come together in My Name, I am in the midst of them," the Bishop declared that "our prayers, by so doing, are more efficacious."

"Here in St. Joseph's, the Blessed Virgin is particularly sensitive to our prayers for it is here that crowds assemble each week to pay her respect under the title of Our Lady of Perpetual Help."

Tribute to Redemptorists
Announcing the consecration of Bishop William T. McCarthy, C.S.S.R., former provincial of the Redemptorist Province and now Military Delegate, the Bishop commended the Redemptorist Fathers for their solicitude for servicemen by their supplying chaplains, even to the making of civilian sacrifices.

The Bishop stated that the Rev. John Brennan, C.S.S.R., now a U. S. Army Chaplain and formerly at St. Joseph's had flown from Hawaii to attend Bishop McCarthy's consecration.

It is announced in word received here from China by way of Siberia and Turkey.

Bill McCarthy Signs As NCCS Director

William E. McCarthy, 483 Magee Ave., one-time basketball coach at Aquinas Institute and Niagara University, has accepted a post with the National Catholic Community Service of the USO.

Mr. McCarthy, supervisor of "white collar projects" for the WPA, will leave that position to come director of the NCCS-USO project at Portland, Me.

He served in World War I and tried to get back in the Army again in this present conflict. At one time he wrote under the pen-name "Insider," a sports column for the CATHOLIC COURIER.

An able organizer and administrator with a keen knowledge of boys, McCarthy is well suited for the post with the NCCS.

When coach at Aquinas he saw his team gain national fame from 1922 to 1927 inclusive. His charges competed in three National Catholic Tournaments at Chicago where they finished near the top. He also coached the Niagara University basketball team.
