

### Bishop W. T. McCarty Is Consecrated For Military Diocese

NEW YORK. — (NC) — In the presence of almost two score of members of the Hierarchy from the United States and Canada, the Most Rev. William T. McCarty, C.S.B., newly-named Military Delegate, was solemnly consecrated Titular Bishop of Anza at ceremonies held Jan. 25 in St. Patrick's Cathedral.

The Most Rev. Francis J. Spellman, Archbishop of New York and Military Vicar, was the consecrator and the co-consecrators were the Most Rev. Thomas E. Mellon, Bishop of Brooklyn, and the Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C., also a Military Delegate.

The sermon was delivered by the Most Rev. Gerald C. Murray, C.S.R., Bishop of Baskatoon.

Among the members of the Hierarchy present was the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester.

An added military touch was given to the solemn ceremony by the fact that Brigadier General William R. Arnold, Chief of Chaplains of the United States Army, and Rear Admiral John J. Brady, U.S.N. (Chaplain Corps), Retired, were deacons of honor at Archbishop Spellman. Many high ranking officers of the Army and Navy were present in the throng which filled the great Cathedral.

#### Bishop Murray Speaks

"A Bishop is never alone," Bishop Murray said in his sermon. "He belongs to that body of men who have succeeded to the Twelve. Every other Bishop is his blood brother equally with him an object of the special love of Christ."

"From heaven, many Saintry Bishops look down today with a keen but serene feeling of spiritual fellowship. There are two of them whose hearts are especially glad."

"St. Paul, the greatest of Missionary Bishops, is the first. Today we keep the memory of his conversion. We recall his first meeting with Christ—on the way to Damascus—his change from a persecutor of the faithful to a vessel of election. As he prayed then he is praying now. Then his prayer was heard. It will not go undecided now—that this Bishop may, through all his years, have something of the zeal, something of the love of Jesus that possessed and consumed his own great heart."

The other is a Bishop who grew old and feeble in the service of God. In eternity, his youth and vigor have been renewed. St. Alphonsus, Bishop McCarty is his son. It was St. Alphonsus who taught him to love Jesus Christ in the Crib, on the Cross, in the Tabernacle. It was St. Alphonsus who taught him to go to the Mother of God—the Blessed Mother—with the simplicity and confidence of a child. It was St. Alphonsus who taught him the glorious Mission of the Church and the love of the Holy Father.

#### Learned To Pray

"It was from St. Alphonsus that he learned how to imitate the Divine Redeemer, the meaning of zeal, how to spend himself and be spent for the salvation of souls."

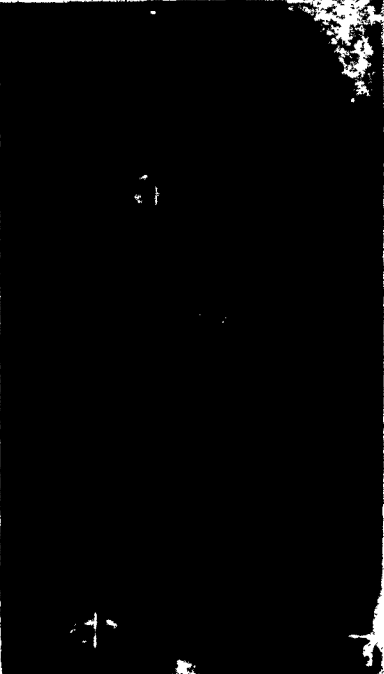
"It was at his saintly father's knee that he learned how to pray, it was under his instruction that he learned how to preach the word of God with straightforward sincerity. It was close to the heart of Alphonsus that he learned how to dispense the Mercies of Christ with prudent kindness."

"It is from his example that he will learn how to be a good Bishop. It is through St. Alphonsus' prayers that he hopes to persevere unto the end in the Service—joyful and loving—of his Divine Master."

"Bishop McCarty is to be a Military Delegate to the Military Vicar. He enters upon his duties with the armed forces in a nation at war. But like the Archbishop of New York, like his senior associate, he knows that the clash of arms and hatred, far from being synonymous, far from being inseparable, are not even compatible in a Catholic—in a priest—in a Bishop. There is only one sentiment in his soul and that is love: Love of God, love of Christ, love of the Church, love of men's souls. His primary work is to help men to be good Christians and good soldiers—to live well for the love of God and to fight valiantly for that same love—as well as for the love of home and country."

### Bishop M. J. O'Connor Consecrated, Becomes Auxiliary of Scranton

SCRANTON, Pa.—(NC)—In the presence of more than 30 members of the Hierarchy, hundreds of clergy and Religious, and a congregation which filled St. Peter's Cathedral, the Most Rev. Martin J. O'Connor on Jan. 27 was consecrated Titular Bishop of Thespiac and Auxiliary Bishop of Scranton.

The Most Rev. William J. Haefey, Bishop of Scranton, was the consecrator and the co-consecrators were two former residents of this diocese—the Most Rev. Gerald P. O'Hara, Bishop of Savannah-Atlanta, and the Most Rev. George L. Leach, Bishop of Harrisburg. The sermon was preached by the Rt. Rev. Magr. Fulton J. Sheen of the Catholic University of America.

Prominent among the members of the laity attending were Governor Edward Martin of Pennsylvania, Postmaster General Frank C. Walker, Mayor Howard J. Snowden, Chief Justice George W. Moxey of the Pennsylvania Supreme Court, members of the City Council, school officials and industrial and business leaders.

At a dinner at the Hotel Casey following the consecration ceremony, at which Bishop Haefey was host to the visiting prelates and clergy, Bishop O'Connor was presented with a purse of \$15,000, a substantial portion of which, he announced, will be used as a fund for aged and infirm priests of the Diocese. The purse was presented on behalf of the priests of the Diocese by the Rt. Rev. Magr. Patrick J. Boland.

The new Bishop is to sing his first Pontifical Mass at the Cathedral Sunday. On February 19 he will be installed as pastor of St. Mary's Church, Wilkes-Barre.
