circle in the country in war activities. M. Frank Dulles, chairman of the War Activities Committee, stated that in co-operation with Chaplain Rev. Gerard L. Amann and with Frank Leach, chairman of Catholic Activities, Auburn Council No. 207, will participate in the Knights' religious demonstration on Washington's Birthday, February 22, at which time Masses will be offered in all parts of the state in memory of the honored dead of the present war and for the safety of the men now serving in the forces.

The 207 Knights of Columbus council in New York State will join in this religious activity. This marks the first project of the newly formed War Activities Committee which is headed by Judge Martin J. Fay of Tunkers. Each council will sponsor a Mass in its own locality on Feb. 22, where local situations demand, several councils will cooperate in prayerful supplication for the safety of the men and women serving in the various branches of the service.

The New York Chapter, which annually holds its Memorial Mass at St. Patrick's Cathedral in New York City for the deceased members of the 40 councils in Manhattan and the Bronx, will join in the state-wide intention.

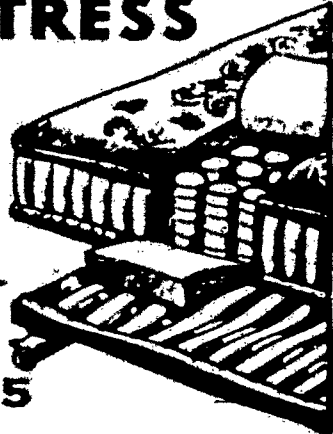

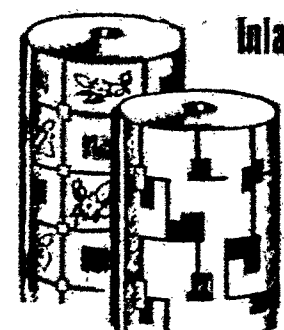
