Fr. Brennan's Sixth Book Is Published

Publication of the sixth book, "For Heaven's Sake" by the Rev. Gerald H. Brennan, pastor of St. Bridget's Church, Rochester, is announced this week.

With the records indicating that almost 25,000 copies of the St. Bridget's parish pastor have been placed in the hands of children throughout the United States in the past four years, Father Brennan is rapidly rising to the position of one of America's most successful juvenile authors.

It is Father Brennan's ability to write to the level of the children's mind in language they can understand which is making him the most successful author of juvenile literature. "The Good Bad Boy," the book published prior to "For Heaven's Sake," was welcomed enthusiastically by both the press and public.

The earlier book is a diary of Pompey Briggs, combination Henry Aldridge, Huckleberry Finn and Tom Sawyer. This latest book contains thirty effective "little talks for little folks" in the good-natured vein which made such a hit with the children, not to mention the teachers and parents, who clamored for more of such instructional material when the first book of this kind from the pen of Father Brennan, "Angel Food" was published back four years ago.

His first book, "Angel Food," which was a collection of stories for children to be told to them by their parents or teachers attracted the attention of editors. They advised Father Brennan to try writing them directly for children. Acting upon this advice he found they were right.

As his background for writing for children was excellent since for seventeen years he has been telling and collecting stories for the children, the author-priest learned the secret of bringing their young minds and hearts by speaking to them on their own level in language they understood.

CINCINNATI.—A total of 255,810 prayer cards, more than three times the number of cards sent out during any preceding year, were issued by the Apostolate to Assist the Dying Non-Catholics. It was announced here by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Raphael J. Markham, director of the movement. The total of cards sent out in 1941 was 72,000.

The Apostolate, a movement to assist dying non-Catholics by supplying them with essential prayers, was stimulated during 1942 by a distribution of a special edition of the card among service men, to whom more than 32,000 cards were sent.
