

10 Child Books Named For March Book Fete

NEW YORK. — Ten books for children are included in a list of 50 selected for Catholic participation in an inter-religious book week in March sponsored by the National Conference of Christians and Jews. A total of 150 books have been selected for the observance with 50 titles assigned to each of the three main religious denominations.

The Committee which selected the Catholic books includes the Rev. J. Gerard Mearns, S.J., Managing Editor of America and editorial chairman of the Pro Parvula Book Club; Mrs. Grace E. Carlwell, superintendent of work for

children, Queensborough Public Library, and Miss Mary Kelly, editorial secretary of the Pro Parvula club.

The titles of the ten children's books are: "Jesus" by Maud Montagu; "With Harp and Lute" by Blanche Jennings Thompson; "Uncle Remus" by Joel Chandler Harris; "The Peepshow Man" by Patrick Coburn; "Francis on the Run" by Hilda van Stockum; "The Red Hat" by Corvella Newcomb; "Rocking Chair Hunch" by Lenora Weber; "St. Thomas Aquinas" by Melissa Maritain; "Old Spain in Our Southwest" by Nina Ortero, and "Juniper Fern" by Rene Bazin.

Guests at the breakfast will include George McAvoy, Ross (Tom) Erwin and Dewey Sawyer, assistant Scout Executive.

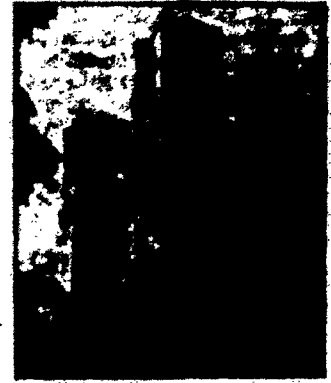
