Reveal Catholic Status Of Inmates At Reformatory

Figures which reveal the small percentage of Catholic in mates admitted to Elmira Reformatory in 1942 who were regular church attendants before admission and of the small number who had attended Catholic

schools at some time or had speat more than six years in a Cathelic school were released this week by the Catholic Chaplain's office. Appearing in an editorial entitled "Statistics" in Don Bosco Bulletin, Feb. 7 fasise, the figures likewise reyeal the results from religious training attained by the Catholic inmates. Of the 406 wise were paroled during 1942, 98 per-cent had received the Sacraments

"First of all we note that only 48 per cent of the commitments during 1942 claimed to be members of the Catholic Church. Thirty of these less than 7 per cent claimed to have attended church regularly. The everage time having elapsed since these new men received the Sacraments was 17 months.

"From an educational point of view it is worthy of note that only 61 or about 12 per cent ever at-


RIGHTS WEEK
